



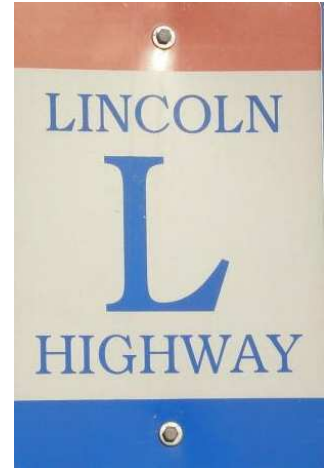
Lincoln Highway Drive Sunday, April 11th

“The Lincoln Highway was the dream of Carl Fisher and Henry Joy. In 1912, Fisher proposed a “coast to coast highway-open to lawful traffic of all description without toll charges.” In 1913, the Lincoln Highway Association was born, and the dream became reality.

This was part of the primary route between Reno and Sacramento, following a historic wagon road. Later, a secondary route crossed the Sierras roughly where Highway 50 is today.



From 1913 to 1930, after which the route was replaced by Highway 40, the Lincoln Highway served as the primary road in northern California from the eastern United States. The highway furthered the dreams of the first settlers who crossed the Sierras in the 1840's. U.S. Highway 40 and today's Interstate 80 continue the vision of these pioneers, to enable travelers to explore and discover the wonders of California.”
